YEAR 6 PARENT/CHILDREN MEETING – TONIGHT AT 5.00PM

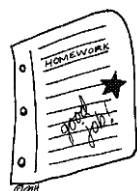

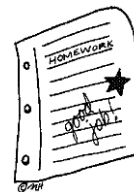
