- [Walking School Buses](#) build community and teach children important road safety skills ready for walking independently as they get older.

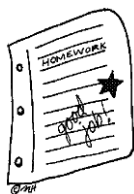

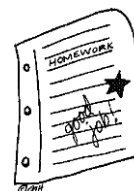
